
Lets Celebrate! - Year 2 - Autumn 2

Subject Specific Vocabulary		
Stereotype	An idea about a group of people that's too simple and often untrue.	
Loneliness	When someone feels sad or low because they feel alone.	
Bullying	When somebody does something unkind to you several times on purpose.	
Materials	Substances like wood, plastic, or metal that things are made from.	
Tradition	A way of doing something that's passed down through generations.	
Celebrate	To mark a special day or event with activities, such as parties, food, or traditions.	
Difference	The way in which things are not the same; something that makes one thing or person unlike another.	

Geographical Similarities and Differences

This term, we'll study two different places: a small area in the United Kingdom and one in India. We'll compare landscapes, homes, and ways people travel in each place. This helps us learn that, while people live differently around the world, we all have things in common too.

Every community has its own traditions, celebrations, and daily routines. We'll explore how different communities celebrate special events, such as Diwali in India and Christmas in the UK. Learning about these differences helps us respect and understand each other's cultures.

Science

In Science, we will look at different materials we see every day, like plastic, wood, metal, and fabric. We'll learn how each material has a special purpose, such as being waterproof or strong. By understanding this, we see how materials are used to make things we need.

PSHE and Celebration

We'll explore different emotions and discuss ways to cope when feeling down. By understanding each other's feelings, we learn to be kind friends, support those who may feel left out, and stand up against bullying. Friendship is built on listening, sharing, and showing respect, helping us create a safe and welcoming school for everyone. Learning these values helps us celebrate each person's unique qualities and make our school a happier place for all.

Maths

Addition and Subtraction: We are learning to make bonds to 100, add and subtract 1s and 10s, add by making 10, add three 1 -digit numbers, work with 2-digit numbers, compare number sentences, and solve missing number problems.

Multiplication and Division: We are learning to recognise and make equal groups, add equal groups, introduce the multiplication symbol, write multiplication sentences, use arrays, make groups by grouping and sharing, work with the 2, 5, and 10 times-tables, divide by 2, 5, and 10, and identify odd and even numbers.
















English
