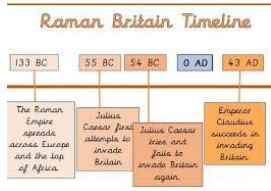
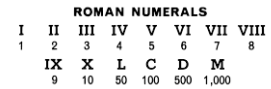


Year 4 Term 1 Homework Grid: Romans - I Am Warrior!

Mild 	Write an acrostic poem for the word ROMANS Ruthless, disciplined warriors conquering all in their path Onwards to battle, never turning back! Can you find any tricks to help you? 	Research Roman coins. Draw and label them on a poster. 	Create a leaflet describing how to care for a pet or another animal. What does it eat? Where does it sleep? How does it exercise? 	Draw, illustrate and label a Roman chariot. You can use pencils, pens or paints. 
Medium 	Create a word search containing some of the key Roman vocabulary you have learnt. 	Create a timeline for the period during which the Romans conquered Britain. 	The Romans worshipped many different gods. Find out about a Roman god and write a short profile about them e.g. What were they god of? What special powers did they have? 	Write a comparison of two animals from different animal groups. This could include animals that are mammals, reptiles, insects etc. Identify their similarities and differences.	A Roman shield was called a scutum. It was light so it could be held in one hand. It was curved so that it would fit around a soldier's body to protect him. It was wide enough so that soldiers could join together in battle! Design and make your own Roman shield. No larger than A3 size please.
Spicy 	Write a diary entry as if you are a Roman soldier or a slave in a Roman villa. Who are you and what is your typical day like? 	Find out about Roman numerals and write some simple calculations for a friend to solve. Don't forget to include the answers too! 	Research Julius Caesar. Write five facts about him. Was he a King? Where did he come from? Who did he marry? How do you know he was powerful? What did he look like?	Research vulnerable animals which are close to extinction. Create a poster which persuades people to help save the endangered animals. Are there specific charities who could help?	Make a model of a Roman villa. You can use junk materials such as cereal boxes, coloured paper, tin foil and cardboard tubes or modelling materials such as plasticene or Lego. Use online images and pictures in non-fiction books to inspire the layout of your villa.

Pick at least 2 tasks to complete from the homework grid. Challenge yourself! Can you complete at least one spicy activity? We will share your wonderful work in class.
