Portraits

Paint or draw a portrait of someone in your family.
What objects or symbols could be included to show the person's character?
Embellish the picture with different material to add interest and texture.

Tudor Explorers

Tudor times were a great period of sea voyages and global exploration.
Make a fact file about one of the Tudor explorers and the new products they brought home.

Local History

Find out about your area in the Tudor times.
You could research to see if there are any maps, buildings or artefacts that still exist from that era.
Choose how you would like to present this. You could create a scrapbook or poster of photos.

Tudor Game

Design a 'Snakes and Ladders' style board game, with pitfalls and lucky breaks on the way to the freedom from the Tower of London.

Shakespeare Play

Choose one of Shakespeare's plays.
Summarise the story as a cartoon strip, a short play script (no more than 2 sides of A4) or record yourself doing a puppet show.

Life of Shakespeare

Find out about Shakespeare's life and plays.
Present your work as either a quiz, poem or a 'Horrible History' style song.

Signatures

Find and copy examples of monarchs' signatures.
Can you create a magnificent, Tudor-style moniker of your own with a signature to match?

Tudor Clothing

Make sketches of Tudor costumes for children and adults, rich and poor.
What can you find out about the clothing styles and decorative details?

Tudor Roses

Why is the Tudor Rose of such importance?
Create a piece of art (sketch/painting/clay model) of a Tudor Rose.

Mary Rose

Find out about the Mary Rose, make a model or draw a picture of her with a short paragraph to explain why she was important.
